n these pattern template pieces, I included a quarter inch seam allowance for all of these applique pieces. Plenty to work with!

Cut out pattern pieces and pin them to fabrics. Out of your first fabric, cut out pattern pieces A, B, and C. Out of the second fabric, cut pattern piece D; and out of the third fabric, cut out pattern piece E.

Heat up your iron . . . Remove paper pattern pieces and turn fabric pieces face down on ironing board, you're going to iron all the seam allowances under -- use spray starch to make them stick. For pieces with corners, piece D for example, which is the body of the teapot . . . fold corner in flat first, like this:

and iron. After all the corners are in, fold in the rest of the seam allowance on all sides, iron flat. For curved lines, clip tiny cuts about 1/8" deep and 1/4" apart along the curve parts; then turn under the seam allowance and iron flat. Lay pieces onto your dishtowel, apron, napkin or what ever you've chosen to decorate, place them where you want them. Remove all pieces but the body of

the teapot and pin that on. Using white thread and tiny stitches, sew body on beginning just below the bottom of where the spout fits in. When you get to the other side where the bottom of the handle starts, fit the handle in, just under the body, and pin the handle on. Finish sewing the body on, over the top -- then slide in the spout, pin it, and finish sewing the body. Sew on spout and handle. Place lid above teapot, leaving little stripe of white space. Pin lid on, then sew, slide little topper under the lid, continue sewing until all is completed.

Voila! It is done, and you are wonderful and the curtain of mechanization did not come between Your mind and Your hand today, so congratulations!
